Welcome to Journey Through Life Ministries' Quarterly Newsletter. We pray you will be blessed by the reading of these inspirational articles.


Our goal is to fulfill the great commission Jesus commanded in Matthew 28:16-20 to "...go and make disciples of all...."

Kingdom Living Is "Heaven's Culture" On Earth - Part 1

"Jesus answered, My kingdom is not of this world: if my kingdom were of this world, then would my servants fight, that I should not be delivered to the Jews: but now is my kingdom not from hence. (John 18:36)

rowing up as a child, I often wondered what Heaven was all about, was it real, where did God live, was He watching over me, does He hear me? My mind even wandered into the realm of death. Where would I go after death? Would I float around with a disembodied spirit from cloud to cloud? Would Heaven be boring and who would I see in Heaven? What was God's purpose for creating humans? All of these unanswered thoughts left me fearful and afraid of heaven and dying.

It wasn't until I came into the kingdom of God and began studying His word that He started revealing to me the mysteries of heaven, hell and life after death. As I began my journey discovering the truth of God's word, I soon learned there are many individuals, like myself, including leaders and pastors who also did not understand the awesome beauty of heaven nor God's promises regarding heaven and earth, which is the inheritance for Believers, and hell which is the fate for unbelievers.

Holy Spirit has recorded many scriptures in the Bible relating to heaven, hell, life after death and what is going to happen to earth in the future, but we have to study and research the word for our answers.

One of the greatest discoveries I learned through my studies is that Heaven is real and it is a physical place. Heaven is invisible to us but it is real and there is activity in Heaven. Heaven is a place of order with a government and culture. Most can think of heaven as a place of "order" but not a place with a government or culture.

For this article we will focus on creation and culture. To understand Heaven and God's purpose for creation and culture, we need to start in the Book of Genesis. Father God created Adam and Eve with the purpose of them ruling and reigning on earth. When God blessed Adam and Eve in Genesis 1:28 He said unto them: "be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it; and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth." Psalms 24:1 we read: "The earth is the Lord's, and the fullness thereof; the world, and they that dwell therein."

Genesis 1:28 and Psalms 24:1 reveals to the reader Father God's purpose and intent for mankind. The earth belongs to the Lord and He created man to rule on His behalf. As the reader continues to Genesis 2:15 God took man, and put him in the Garden of Eden to "dress it and to keep it." God's intent was never for man to "own" earth! According to Genesis 2:15 man's responsibility was to take care of the Garden and to protect it ("keep" in Greek means to guard or to protect).

Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it; and have dominion....



Adam and Eve, created in the image of God (Gen. 1:26), were to manage earth for God with the culture of heaven.

God's plan for creation was and still is for Heaven's culture to be infused in earth. When God blessed Adam and Eve that blessing was to flow to every human born from the loins of Adam. To be fruitful and to multiple was not limited to just birthing children, God was also blessing present and future endeavors such as, ministry's, finances, jobs, etc. God was blessing the fruit of their hands! When Adam and Eve sinned, God's purpose for mankind and earth was not aborted.

What is the culture of Heaven? It is a government with commandments and statutes of love, joy, contentment, peace, justice, unity, and equality for all. Heaven's culture is one of abundance for all that trust in God for their provisions. The Books of Exodus, Deuteronomy and Numbers gives the reader a glimpse of heaven's culture when God established the nation of Israel.

<u>Wilderness</u>: When God freed the children of Israel from Egyptian slavery, He took them into the wilderness to speak to them and to declare to them their purpose. He was going to make them a nation with a "heavenly" culture, which is holy (Lev. 20:7), influencing earth with "heaven's culture." He was also going to give them land He promised their father Abraham. Land to rule and reign! (Gen. 13:16-17).


The Israelites were to be a "light" to a lost and dying world (Lev. 17:8; 18:26). While in the wilderness, God's plan was to: establish them as a "nation" with a government and culture; to purge out of them the influences of Egypt, and to teach them heaven's culture. They were to take heaven's culture with them into the "promised land." Unfortunately, they failed! The children of Israel refused to

follow God's heavenly culture, which were commandments, statutes, precepts and promises of abundant living found in the Bible. As, when Adam and Eve sinned, the children of Israel's disobedience didn't abort God's plan.

In the fullness of time God sent His only begotten son, Jesus. He was a Light to a dying world! He came to teach us how to live as kingdom citizens and to show us the way to eternal life. Jesus' first sermon was "repent, for the Kingdom of God is near!" Also, whenever He told a parable, He began it with "the Kingdom of God is like..." Jesus always talked about the kingdom, heaven, and hell. In John 18 he tells the listeners that His kingdom is not of this world. Do you still believe Heaven is not real or physical? Think about this for a moment! If the kingdom of God is not physical, then why did Jesus tell the disciples "in my Father's house are many mansions." Houses and mansions are physical buildings, they are not spiritual building. Also, when God told Moses to build the Tabernacle in the wilderness, it was a replicate of the "real Tabernacle in Heaven."

Jesus always taught the disciples the truth of the kingdom by word and action! When asked what commandments to keep, He stated LOVE as the greatest commandment—to love God with all your heart and soul and to love your neighbor as self. Jesus died on the Cross to establish a new covenant with mankind. A covenant of Grace by His shed blood and to establish His church, which are the ones that accept him as Lord and Savior of their life.

As the Church we are to be the light to a lost and dying world, leading them to Christ Jesus and teaching them "heaven's culture." Are you being a light for Jesus.? Are you influencing your environment with the Love of Jesus? Are you living "heaven's culture" of love, joy, peace, contentment, etc., enjoying the promised abundant life? he Apostle Paul, also known by his Jewish name Saul of Tarsus, was born a Roman citizen to Jewish parents in Tarsus, which is modern eastern Turkey. Tarsus, during Paul's time was ancient and prosperous, he describes it as "no ordinary city!" Industries in Tarsus included weaving and tent making—a craft Paul would use later to subsidize his travels. Paul's family lineage can be traced to the tribe of Benjamin. According to historians, Paul was a bald-headed, bowlegged short man with a big nose, and an unbroken eyebrow that lay across his forehead like a dead caterpillar. He was not married. Prior to Paul's Damascus conversion he was dedicated to persecuting the early disciples of Jesus in the area of Jerusalem. Acts 8:3 says, "he made havock of the church haling men and women to prison." Why the persecution of the Jews? Paul before his conversion, was a Pharisee, who studied the Jewish scriptures and religious laws under Gamaliel, who was a member of the ruling council of the Sanhedrin. The Pharisees were the ones who condemned Jesus to death because they said He blasphemed by stating He was the Son of God, making himself equal to God.

On Paul's journey to Damascus with letters from the high priest to persecute the Jews who believed on Jesus Christ, Jesus calls out to Paul from heaven saying "Saul, Saul, why persecuteth thou me?" Paul actually thought he was doing the right thing by persecuting the Jews, but he soon discovered his wrong doings. Jesus had Paul to visit a disciple named Ananias to tell him how to be saved. After Paul's conversion Holy Spirit took him to Arabia for three years, which I believe was his teaching and calling as an Apostle.

After Paul's three years training, under Holy Spirit, he was sent back to Damascus to preach Jesus as the Messiah. The one who once was the persecutor is now being persecuted by the Pharisees and Paul had to leave Damascus. Jesus sent Paul on several missionary trips in which he was instrumental in setting up many Churches in Asia Minor, Greece, Corinth, Thessalonica, etc.

Holy Spirit spoke through Paul to write several letters to the churches which are now Books of the Bible. The two books I believe to be very valuable for understanding Jesus going to the Cross and what benefits are afforded a believer regarding salvation, sanctification, redemption, and the sin-nature are Romans and Hebrews. Paul's faithfulness in the work of the Lord cost him his life, but he said "to live is Christ, but to die is gain" (that is eternal life). The books of the Bible that Paul wrote are not only full of hope and promise of a better life with Christ, these books also teach us how to live a Christ-like life on earth until Jesus returns for the Church. Paul's writing are worth reading several times, because they are filled with revelations needed for every Christian who makes up the Church.

e are at the end of the first quarter and we are still receiving questions about cutting expenses to save money and how to setup an emergency fund. God never intended for His children to live in lack! We live in lack because too many in the body of Christ have adopted the world's mindset of "buy now pay later!" This type of attitude causes many to struggle financially living paycheck to paycheck. Following are some suggested ideas for cutting costs to help setup an emergency fund or savings:

ATM Fees: Many stores now offer third party ATM machines for customer's convenience, but did you know there are fees associated with using these machines. Using these third party machines, will cost you anywhere from \$3.00 to \$5.00 per transaction. Use only ATM Machines linked to your bank.


Late Fees: Paying these types of fees is like flushing money down the toilet! Plus, late fees lower your credit scores. Make it a habit to pay your accounts at least 4 to 5 days in advance. Establishing a budget reminds you of bills due each month. Paying late fees is not being a good steward of your money!

Magazines Subscriptions: Many people subscribe to magazines which they never read and end up throwing away. What a waste of money! If you have a smart phone, download the Library App "Flipster," this app allows you access to just about every published magazine. Get re-acquainted with the Library and cancel the unread magazine subscriptions!

Lunch: Eating out is very costly! Try packing your lunch and watch the savings add up. Instead of drinking sodas, juices, or those fancy coffee/tea drinks all day at work, try water. Start carrying a water bottle to work! Water is much better for you anyway!

Cable: This is a big one! Consumers are spending unnecessary money yearly for services they don't need and for channels they don't watch. Cut the cable! There are other options such as Roku, etc., and using an antenna for local channels. Think about it, how much TV are you really watching, especially if you are working! Do your homework, why be locked into a contract when most shows are streamed for free

Impulse Spending: This is a major problem with consumers — we don't think before buying. We buy out of "feelings of the moment" and Vendors know this. Before making any purchase, especially big ticket items, pray about it and give yourself two to three days of thinking about the advantages or disadavanges of purchasing this product.



Torry is a state of anxiety or uncertainty over actual or potential problems. It gives way to anxiety or unease; allowing one's mind to dwell on difficulty or troubles. For this article we will explore *Matthew 6:24-37* for revelation about worry.

Worry is a waste of precious time and steals joy, peace and productivity. It does not add (v. 27), but subtracts from our life. In math, anything that is subtracted (except 0), takes away from the original number and the result is always less than the original. We are all given 24 hours in a day—that equates to 1440 minutes or 86,400 seconds. Worry subtracts from our day because we spend time worrying instead of being productive, resting or just enjoying our day. Often before we know it, our day is over and worry has taken up most or all of our time. We shouldn't worry about tomorrow (or even yesterday) but focus on one day at time--for each day has enough problems of its' own (v. 34). Once time is gone we can't get it back.

Worry can lead to fear. Worry about what we will eat, how we look, what others think about us, about our loved ones, how we will pay our bills, what the doctor report says, is futile. (vs. 25 & 31) When excessive worry becomes fear, it is crippling. It keeps one from moving forward in life by making one feel stagnant and unproductive. Fear is not from God but the devil. God promised to supply all our needs according His riches in glory (Philippians 4:19) and has not given us the spirit of fear but of power, love and a sound mind (2 Timothy 1:7). We can either have faith or fear about a circumstance, problem or decision. It's a choice. Worry is the opposite of faith and often what we worry about may never happen. Fear has two acrostic meanings: Forget Everything And Run or Face Everything And Rise.

Worry can lead to physical health problems. Extreme worrying can affect daily life so much that it may interfere with one's appetite, lifestyle, relationships, sleep, and job performance. Many people who worry excessively are so anxiety-driven that they seek relief in destructive habits such as overeating, cigarette smoking, pornography or using alcohol and drugs. Addictions are hard to break without professional, medical or spiritual assistance and can last months or often years.

Worry in excess can lead to Depression. Spending too much time worrying about or focusing on problems or the issues of life can lead to depression. Depression is a series medical illness that triggers hopelessness and affects the way one thinks, feels, or acts. We become what we think about! Our daily thoughts, directs our actions, which ultimately directs our life. Worry builds strongholds that keep us in bondage and can sink us into despair. Worry can lead to negative confessions in our mind and sometimes on our tongue. What we think about and believe (Proverbs 23:7) and what we often speak about (Proverbs 18:21, Luke 6:45), usually becomes our reality.

Strongholds are built when a thought or belief erects in our mind and is strongly defended or upheld. When we accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, the word of God becomes our reality (truth). Whenever our thoughts and words aren't in agreement with who God says we are, then they are based upon a lie. We don't have to receive or even mediate on every negative thought that comes into our mind or every negative word spoken from another person. Second Corinthians 10:5 states that we have the authority to tear down strongholds and take captive (*cont'd page 13*)



s men of God we have both authority and power from God to stand our ground in time of warfare with the enemy of our soul, satan.

God has provided all the equipment we need in His word, the Bible, but we must put it on and exercise our authority in order to defeat the enemy.

Acknowledge God In all your

ways and

He will direct your path.

Prov. 3:5-6

One great example found in the Bible of a man taking authority over the enemy is Nehemiah. He faced much adversity from the enemy when doing God's work for his own people but God made his journey victorious. (Nehemiah Chapters 1 thru 13.)

Artaxerxes Longimanus was ruling the Medi-Persian Empire when news reached Nehemiah about the deplorable conditions in Jerusalem. Nehemiah's brother, Hanani and his friends, had been to Jerusalem and informed Nehemiah of how the Jews in Jerusalem were in great affliction and reproach. The wall of the city was broken down and the gates were burned with fire.

Appearing sad before the king was unlawful, but Nehemiah after hearing the news of his beloved Jerusalem was with great sadness when he offered wine before the king in Shushan. When the king was informed of Nehemiah's sadness, the king put a plan together for the repairing of the walls in Jerusalem. God gave Nehemiah favor with the king!

The return occurred and the walls were rebuilt in 445 B.C. Arriving in Jerusalem, Nehemiah lost no time with his plans. During his first night there he arose and took a few men with him to investigate the conditions of the walls and gates. He went out at the Valley Gate, past the Dragon Wall, the Dung Gate and on to the Fountain Gate and finally to the king's pool. Neither his friends nor the rulers knew his plan until he called them together and made known the secret of his heart and the king's decree. In spite of severe opposition from Sanballat and Tobiah, Nehemiah and those who helped him rebuilt the walls and gates in 52 days. Threats were poured out with great contempt against the builders. A conspiracy was formed to fall upon them with an armed forced, but Nehemiah was undaunted in his purpose and courage.

He finished the task even though his men worked with a trowl in one hand and a sword in the other. Nehemiah worked with Ezra, and after 12 years returned to Babylon, but his stay there was not for long. His heart and soul were in Jerusalem. He returned to Jerusalem where he stayed, possibly the rest of his life, though we do not know where or when he died.



every thought and make it obedient to Christ. God is the designer and source of our life and is the cure for worry. He provides for all of His creation (nature, animals, birds, mankind, etc.). We are much more important to Him than nature! (vs. 26, 28-32). When we seek first after God's Kingdom and His righteousness (**His way of doing and being right—the attitude & character of God**), our needs will be met also. (v. 33)

Personal Experience:


Many battle worry, anxiety and depression in the body of Christ and often these areas are ignored or unnoticed. They do a great job of masking or keeping it hidden—looking great on the outside but hurting on the inside. I want to share what I learned from my experiences with depression. If I can help someone in their struggle, it is well worth it.

Matthew 6:24 talks about money and how you cannot serve two masters--for you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. It's interesting how this verse about money (idols) is right before the verses about worry. Money often leads to worry — having too much can lead to hoarding or the fear of losing it; whereas too little can lead to anxiety because of lack or not having enough.

Throughout the years that I struggled with worry and anxiety, which lead to major battles with depression and burnout, that ultimately took me out of Corporate America and caused financial woes after I left. God allowed a way of escape for me by opening up an opportunity for me to get Disability income. I thank God for the income but with it, came restrictions. I am still struggling with depression, lack and debt today but I have learned to focus on one day at a time and know, without a shadow of doubt, that God is in control of my life and has my back. I tried to accomplish everything in my own strength in the past, often without seeking God, and He has proven to me, time and time again, that when I trust Him, my needs are met. I believe my circumstances will improve and I continue to seek God for direction every day. I meditate on Philippians 4:4-9 regularly. God is my lifeline when I sink into despair about my life and He pulls me out because of His unfailing love. My relationship with God is so much more intimate today and I praise Him for letting my tests become my testimony.


"And Ruth said, entreat me not to leave thee, or to return from following after thee: for whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God."

(Ruth 1:16)

The Book of Ruth is about the Journey of two women surviving through an adversity, which formed a friendship of love and trust. Through this wonderful story we experience the unseen hands of God guiding them into a destiny that has been recorded by Holy Spirit for generations after them to read and to learn of the love of a caring Father.

The Book of Ruth begins with the story of a famine in the land of Bethlehem-Judah. Because of this famine, a man name Elimelech uprooted his wife, Naomi, and two sons, Mahlon and Chilion, and took them into the country of Moab to survive. While in Moab, the two sons married Moabite women by the names of Orpah and Ruth. In the process of time, Elimelech dies and shortly after his death, his sons Mahlon and Chilion died, leaving behind three widows—Naomi, Orpah and Ruth. These deaths hit Naomi so hard that she told others "do not call me Naomi, but Mara, for the Almighty hath dealt very bitterly with me. I went out full, and the LORD hath brought me home again empty:" (Ruth 1:20)

Naomi decided to return home! She encouraged her two daughters-in-law to return to the home of their Mothers. Orpah agrees and returned to her land of idols. Ruth, however chooses to remain with Naomi. She told Naomi "entreat me not to leave thee, or to return from following after thee: for whither thou goest, I will go; and where thou lodgest, I will lodge: thy people shall be my people, and thy God my God" (Ruth 1:16). What a wonderful declaration! Ruth chose to separate herself from the land of idolatry worship! She has chosen to worship the "living God" of Naomi! How many would make a decision like that—leave your family and a country you are familiar with to take a journey to an unknown country with an entirely different culture. Ruth had to learn about God from Naomi! Naomi shared with Ruth stories about the strength and power of her God—Elohim; and how He rescued her entire nation from a cruel dictator with a "strong and mighty arm." Ruth has now accepted Christ as her Savior, her Lord, and Master! For ten years Naomi was a "light" in a dark and dying world of idolatry worship, but unfortunately only "one soul" responded to the light—Ruth. Are you a "light" in your community, your workplace, your home. There is always "one soul " that needs to hear about the "Living God" who is full of grace and mercy. One soul wanting to know how to come into the Kingdom of God Almighty! Let your light shine brightly in this dark world—that soul is waiting!

Did you ever ask yourself the question, "why do I do what I do?" According to Jesus, we should always examine our motives, such as "why" and for "what" reason we are doing them.



But when thou doest alms, let not thy left hand know what thy right hand doeth: That thine alms may be in secret: and thy Father which seeth in secret himself shall reward thee openly" Matthew 6:1-4 KJV).

The point is that we don't need to make a lot of noise so people can see us and give us a pat on the back when we do something, but rather stay humble enough to know that even when we don't receive the praises of men, God will reward us in the end. When we do this we automatically gain God's favor, and his blessings will follow us on our journey.



Te hear a lot today about "Living the Abundant Life" or "Walking in Your Destiny," "Name It and Claim It," "Sowing Seeds for blessings, and many other programs claiming prosperity living. Now, if these formulas worked, don't you think every professed Christian would be wealthy and living the American dream? I've been serving in ministry for many years, and God has led me to minister to many individuals who believed these prosperity programs but have become discouraged because these program's formulas didn't make them wealthy, nor fix their problems. Some have come to believe life as we know it is all they can ever hope for; and when we die this is the end of our life. How sad! Fortunately, their way of thinking is wrong. Most individual's choose to think this way because they have been badly deceived and now don't want to accept God on His terms, which is a "faith walk." Listening to the wrong voice can cause much harm to an individual's life. John 10:10 gives us an understanding as to whose voice is misleading many by deception – it is our enemy satan. Satan takes the truth of God's word and distorts it just enough to deceive the hearer about God's promises, leaving his victim confused and discouraged about God. John 10:10 teaches three powerful truths regarding "abundant living:"

<u>Truth Number 2</u>: Jesus offers "eternal life" to whosoever will believe in Him and what He did on the Cross. Now that's prosperity! When we become the children of God through the "born again" experience, we have been set free to live life on earth by experiencing the benefits from heaven on earth. The Children of God have the "Spirit of the Living God," which is "Holy Spirit," dwelling in them. A "living life" that money nor programs can buy! Holy Spirit guides us into receiving our spiritual blessings. Prosperity programs can't guarantee spiritual blessings, our **FAITH** in God does!

<u>Truth Number Three</u>: Every believer can live life more abundantly. God is not partial! But we need to prioritize our way of living by putting God first. Money and material possessions doesn't give anyone "life more abundantly." Jesus and what He did on the Cross is what gives us "life more abundantly. If you are having financial problems, the Bible records many scriptures about money management along with principles for obtaining financial security. Living life more abundantly is having the peace of God, which is the greatest wealth we could ever have. Peace the world will never know! With God's peace nothing will move us, we will be content in our season of life trusting God for our every need.

If you are not living an abundant life, found only in Christ, James 4:3 tells us "ye ask, and receive not, because ye ask amiss," In other words, what is your motive for asking? So, I encourage you to set aside time every day to read and study the Word. Satan can't deceive you if you know the Truth. If you are in need, don't seek programs, instead, seek God's Word for your answers and help. And remember, God doesn't work the same in everyone's life! No two testimonies are the same – and no two blesses are alike! He doesn't manufacturer prosperity programs for His children. He blesses us according to our TRUST in Him, regardless of our needs. Friends, allow Holy Spirit to teach you True Abundant Living. The world system will never satisfy you, it will only destroy you!



Inited States is ranked 12th as one of the "most obese countries in the world." Many studies attribute this to the fact that we have easy accessibility to calorie-rich foods, lack of much needed exercise, poor health, and various changes our bodies go through at different age periods, beginning at the age of 30 (metabolism slowing down). So the question is, are you trying to lose weight? If yes, how are you going about losing weight? Have you been successful in losing weight and keeping it off?

Losing unwanted weight is not difficult! It is a change of mindset! A change in how we see food in the area of nutrition and value for the body; and how we understand that calorie-rich foods are nothing more than temptation. Ask yourself why do you eat "empty junk food" filled with sugars and other ingredients that are very harmful to the body. Empty junk food includes large amounts of sugar and refined flours which increases your hunger for more. These types of junk foods are designed to be addictive and harms the body. 1 Corinthians 6:12 (NASB) says, "All things are lawful for me, but I will not be mastered by anything." Now Ask yourself, are going to allow yourself to be tempted by unhealthy cravings for foods that bring harm to your body, such as diabetes, heart disease, inflammation, etc., especially foods that add nothing good to the body.

Foods your body really crave are vegetables, nuts, seeds, berries and lean protein. Eating these types of food will leave you feeling more satisfied and you will find yourself eating less and not desiring those "empty-junk foods," plus you will have more energy. If you are trying to shed a few pounds, and if you are up to a challenge, why not fast for 21 days from empty junk food that leaves you tired and hungry! Eliminate the following foods from your diet for 21 days: **sugar**, **breads**, **cookies**, **cakes**, **donuts**, **muffins**, **candy**, **pastries**, **chocolate**, **white bread**, **ice cream**, **fast foods**, **chips**, **fried foods**, **and sodas**. Replace them with vegetables, berries, nuts, and lean protein and watch the pounds disappear.

Don't forget God gave us two feet! Use those feet for walking! If you have never walked for exercise, start with 15 minutes a day and work your way up to one hour a day walking. This is good exercise for everyone and not very difficult to achieve. Actually, you will get to know your neighbors and shed a few pounds in the process!

People, Places, or Things In The Bible

Did you know the that the Moabites, Ammonites, and Edomites are related to the children of Israel?

The Moabites descended from Moab, they are described as being descendants of Ben-ammi, who was the son of Lot (Abraham's nephew) and Lot's oldest daughter (Genesis 19:37). The kingdom of Moab stretched "north and south of the Arnon River" with its capital at Dibon. The Moabites worshiped the god Chemosh, dating to the end of Late Bronze Age. Ruth was from the Moabites! The Moabites are cousins to the children of Israel!

The Ammonites descended from Ben-ammi, who was the son of Lot (Abraham's nephew) and Lot's younger daughter (Genesis 19:38). The capital of the Iron Age kingdom of Ammon was Rabbah, which is located at modern-day Amman, Jordan. The Ammonites' worshiped the god Milcom. The Ammonites are cousins to the children of Israel!

The Edomites are descendants of Esau, Jacob's twin and Isaac's oldest son (Genesis 36). The Edomites controlled an area east of the Arabah, from the Zered to the Gulf of Aqaba. Their capital was Bozrah, which sat in the northern part of their territory. Although no name of an Edomite deity is given in the Bible, archaeologists know from inscriptions that the Edomites' worshiped the god of Qaus (or Qos). Esau and Jacob/Israel are brothers!
