



After ten years working for a large corporation, Debbie was given her walking papers. Permanently laid off—no warning! What a shock! Debbie was numb!

As the days past, Debbie began blaming God for the loss of her job. She rehearsed her job loss to anyone who would listen, followed by "I'm going to lose my home, my car and everything—how am I going to eat or live?" Debbie allowed her "joy" to be stolen, which left her feeling hopeless. Do you know someone in a similar situation, or are you going through what you would call a "hopeless" situation? Too many Believers are living their lives as if hope didn't exist, actually they act as if God were dead.

January 25, 1999, I lost my job of 19 years. My first reaction was not to praise God or pray to Him. Instead, I allowed fear and feelings of hopelessness to surround me. My thoughts were, "how will I survive, and what am I going to do?" I immediately forgot about the God I knew. As the days went by I started feeling nervous and anxious.

While going through this trying experience, I suddenly realized there are two forces in this world God and satan. I was blaming God for the evil that happened to me. I began to remember, God doesn't cause evil. So I went to the only source that could help me—Father God, and He lead me to read the story of Joseph.

As I studied the story of Joseph, I discovered his story was similar (Genesis 37) to mine. Joseph was secure in his family life with his father and his faith in God. But, his brothers hated him and sold him into slavery. Well the same is true today of God's children. We are

greatly loved by our Father God, and satan hates us and devises schemes to kill, steal, or to destroy us—even causing us to lose our jobs.

In Genesis 39, the story continues by telling us that while sold into slavery, the Lord God was with Joseph and he prospered in all he did.

Like Joseph, I learned that God was not far from me. He was with me in my troubles; and, as He was aware of Joseph's troubles, He was well aware of my troubles.

I also learned that, just like He had a "way of escape for Joseph, He already had "a way of escape" for my troubles. I had to learn to trust in Him. Psalm 42:5 questions us with "Why are you cast down, O my soul? And why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God, for I shall yet praise Him For the help of His countenance." When we begin to trust God for our situations and turn our problem into "praise," we are telling God our problem is not bigger than Him.

May of 1999, the same year I lost my job, Father God placed me into a better position; and guess where He put me? With the same company that laid me off, but at a different location.

The Lord gave me two scriptures showing me what Debbie and I failed to do in our time of trouble—trust Him and praise Him!

Psalm 28:7 tells us that "The Lord is my strength and my shield; My heart trusted in **Him**, and I am helped; Therefore my heart greatly rejoices, And with my song I will **praise Him**." and Psalm 145:14-18 tells us

FINANCIAL FITNESS-REV. GEORGETTA HEAD

The question was asked: "at what age should parents begin teaching children money management?"

This is a good question, because most of today's adults were not taught money management as a youth and are now suffering the consequences.

So, I personally believe when a child is old enough to ask for purchases, such as electronics, expensive toys, designer clothing, etc. they are of age to understand how money works, such as the value of money and the purpose of money. Otherwise, when we buy our children all they ask for, without teaching them the value of money, we are sending them the wrong message.

On the other hand, when we instruct our children what the costs of purchasing high ticket items and the sacrifices others may have to make to buy them, we are teaching them appreciation and gratitude, and planting seeds for them to become responsible adults in the area of money management.

Giving children an allowance is a great way to began teaching money management. Have your children earn their

allowance by doing chores around the house. Parents can determine how much allowance to pay each week by assigning a value to the chores they assign to their children.

For teaching children 6 to 10 years of age the principles for saving and tithing try using the "jar method."

Using three empty baby food jars, label each one as follows: 1st jar with "S" for savings; 2nd jar with "J" for Jesus (tithing), and 3rd jar with "O" for other toward purchasing desired items. Then, have your children start a wish list with their "wants" (toys, electronics, etc.) that you don't normal purchase. Explain to them that the "S" jar is 10% of their earned monev (allowance) for ongoing savings. The "J" jar is 10% of their earned money for tithing at church, and the "O" jar is for purchases they want. Teach them how much they will need to save in the "O" jar for items on their "wants" list. Encourage them not to spend from the "S" jar and to always pay their tithes to Jesus. Let them know also, that when the "O" jar is empty, they must start over again by adding to the "O" jar to save for the other items on their "wants" list.

Another way to encourage younger children to save for their wants is that if they save an agreed upon amount of money in the "O" jar, is that you will match the saved amount to help them purchase one of their "wants" items.

For older children, 11 years and up, using the plastic envelope system is a great idea. These plastic envelopes can be purchased at your local dollar store or grocery store.

Label their envelopes the same as the jars. For expenditures from the "O" envelope you should encourage your older children to keep track of monies spent from the "O" envelope. This will teach them how much money they waste in unnecessary categories, such as candy, etc.

Any other monies the children receive, such as birthday money; Christmas money; etc., should also be distributed in the jar method or the plastic envelope system.

Children love routines, so, teaching children at an early principles about money will promote good habits to carry into their adult life. Remember, consistency and patience is the key to their success.

MEN OF THE BIBLE "JEPHTHAH"-FROM REJECTION TO HERO - ELDER. C. HEAD



During the early years of Jephthah's life, he was, in the eyes of most people considered a worthless person. He was rejected by his own brothers, drove away from his home and lost his inheritance; all because his mother was a harlot (prostitute).

In the eleventh chapter of Judges, we read the events of his story and the rejection from men because of his outward appearance—a condition from birth in which he had no control.

Jephthah's name means "who God sets free" or "a breaker through." For a period of Jephthah's life, he was a troublemaker. He earned his reputation by gathering to himself a group of men who had the same reputation who went out and took advantage of people by stealing and robbing in order to survive-a habit not uncommon during this time period.

Jephthah later rose above this life style to become a hero to the people of Israel.

When Israel's enemies, the Ammonites, sought to regain territory given to them by a covenant with God. they needed help to stop them. Though his people had rejected Jephthah before, they were now impressed with his ability to fight as a warrior. They now turned to him for help to win the war. He agreed to help Israel only if they would set him up as their leader to become their Judge.

The Elders of Gilead agreed with him and he went on to defeat the Ammonites. As a result, he Judged Israel for six vears after becoming their

Because of Jephthah's action to defend God's people. God placed his name on His honor roll of faith (Hebrews 11:32-33).

We too may have suffered from rejection from men and even from our own family members, who may have written us off, but just as Jephthah allowed God to change his rejection and turn it into an honor for the Kingdom, so can we. We may be rejected of men, but God has not rejected us and if we would just give Him a chance, He will bring us into the realization of how we are of great value to Him.


Meshach, Shadrach and Abednego? Oh yes, my Lord.

"FOOD" FOR THOUGHT (ON INTEGRITY) - REV. GEORGETTA HEAD

Youth Minister Jim hung up the phone a little upset. This was his third time calling Mike this week. Jim has to meet the Youth Group in one hour to take them on a fishing trip. Mike promised the group they could use some of his fishing equipment. Now Mike is ignoring Jim's phone calls—this put the Youth Minister in an awkward position.

Now Jim will have to purchase the needed equipment for the fishing trip—something he hadn't planned on doing. This unexpected expense will take a hit to his budget. Jim thought, "I will never trust Mike again, or anyone else for that matter!"

Mike displayed a reputation of poor integrity, he put Jim in a bad position in three ways: the Youth Group would now have a late start; Jim will have to spend money he hadn't budgeted for; and now Jim's trust in mankind has been tainted.

Father God tells us in His Word that we are to pay what we vow or not to make a vow if we don't intend to follow through with it, and, that a person of integrity is honest in all that he/she does. This is a person that walks in truth! (1 John 3:18 "...let us not love in word or in tongue, but in deed and in truth.")

When Mike promised Jim to use his fishing equipment, he should have honored the promise; in other words he should have put action with his words, but what he did was to make a bad name for himself by not being truthful.

Leviticus 19:11 also instructs believers to not "deal falsely, nor lie to one another." Lies and deception is not walking in truth! When we don't walk in "truth" we can not expect God to bless us, because God does not honor untruth. What God does honor is truth!

When the Father God's children walk in truth, with Him and with each other, He is pleased with us (Proverbs 16:7). We are told in the Word that King David "behaved wisely" in all that he did—he walked in integrity. This pleased God and God blessed and protected David everywhere he went and blessed whatever he put his hand to do.

Father God is no different today! God promises that as we walk in the integrity of our heart, it will please Him and we will be blessed with His promises of protection, provision, and guidance as we are obedient.

If you a have problem speaking truth to others, repent to God and seek His help to change your ways to walk in integrity. After all, "A good name is to be chosen rather than great riches, loving favor rather than silver and gold" (Proverbs 22:1).

Ever wonder why you feel so empty at times? We read in the second chapter of Ecclesiastes, that King Solomon knew all about feeling empty. He referred to it as "vanity and vexation of spirit."

The Bible tells us no other person on earth had as much as king Solomon.

But, Ecclesiastes 2:16 gives us the conclusion of what Solomon was seeking in all his accomplishments and wealth. It was peace and joy found only when we keep our heavenly Father first on our priority list..

King Solomon forgot what his purpose was and what would bring true contentment that nothing else on earth would satisfy—"he was born to serve the Lord."


