

Welcome to Journey Through Life Ministries' Quarterly Newsletter. We pray you will be blessed by the reading of these inspirational articles.


Our goal is to fulfill the great commission Jesus commanded in Matthew 28:16-20 to "...go and make disciples of all...."

Resting In His Word

Because my people hath forgotten me, they have burned incense to vanity, and they have caused them to stumble in their ways from the ancient paths, to walk in paths, in a way not cast up; to make their land desolate, and a perpetual hissing; every one that passeth thereby shall be astonished, and wag his head. (Jeremiah 18:15-16 KJV)

o you remember as a kid listening to older people sitting around talking about how things used to be when they were younger? They would remark, "life was so much simpler and easier," and the younger generation would laugh at them or say "that's in the olden days, no one wants to here that!" Now I find myself saying the same words the older people did when I was younger, "life was so much simpler and easy in my days, and people were more personal." The younger generation respond and laugh just as we did at their age: "that was in the olden days, life is much better now." The question is; "is life much better today, than generations past?" When one takes the time to review history's past, yes life may seem better now, because in the "olden days" times were much harder and people had much less, but we need to define what makes life better now and are people of today much better off than our ancestors of past?

Now when I talk with older individuals and ask about their growing up years, they all have several things in common: people were content with what they had; people were thankful to God for everyday blessings; people knew their neighbors and helped one another; the hard times made them stronger; they used the Bible as their wisdom for living; and they looked to God for their help and learned to "REST" in Him. Their definition of better is "resting in God."

When talking with today's generation of people, they are unthankful, impersonal; want everything now, and can't handle hard times. I believe times are just as hard now as in our ancestor's day—same problems just different packaging. From the Book of Ecclesiastes 1:9 we learn "The thing that hath been, it is that which shall be; and that which is done is that which shall be done: and there is no new thing under the sun." So according to this scripture everything that has been done yesterday, today and in the future has been done. Each generation builds from the previous generation, enhancing what has already been done. So with this truth revealed to us, why is it that mankind of today are so prideful of what they think is so new, especially since we are building on old dreams, ideas and technology. Why is it that many, although wealthy or well off, lack peace and stability in their lives. After reading articles about several inventors and entrepreneurs they seem to believe they are "lone rangers" in their ventures. They credit everything to self! They forgot one important person—God!



Plus, the world is not better off because of their advanced inventions and technologies. The answer to all of these questions is found in Jeremiah 18:15-16. With each generation, we have forgotten God our Creator and source of our abilities and creativity.


God blessed the children of Israel when He brought them out of Egyptian slavery and took them to their final "resting" place, the "Promised Land." In the Promised Land, God established them as one of the wealthiest nations in the world. Unfortunately, with each generation, they forgot their Creator, who was their Deliverer and Source of their blessing. They were to be a light unto a loss and dying world, but instead of being a light, they took on all the ways of the wicked world by worshiping idols made with their hands and became prideful with the wealth and inventions God blessed them with. God, in His mercy, sent many, many messengers (prophets) to warn them of their sin of worshiping idols that could neither speak, see, hear, nor deliver them from the hands of their enemies and to remind them of their covenant with Him

God informed them through His prophet Jeremiah (in v.15) that their burning incense to vanity (idols), caused them to stumble in their ways from the "ancient paths," and to walk in paths, He did not instruct them to walk in. The "ancient paths" spoken of here is God's Word! During the children of Israel's wilderness experience, God established commandments for them for a blessing, if obedient, and a curse for disobedience. Each commandment was read aloud to them and they agreed to obey and follow God. God promised to lead them into the Promised Land for them to enter into a spiritual "Rest" with Him as

their God. Unfortunately, because of their failure to be obedient to God's Word and to enter into His Rest, we read in Jeremiah 18:16 "their land became desolate, and a perpetual hissing; every one that passeth thereby shall be astonished, and wag his head."

Currently, we can see similar happenings in United States. Our country was founded on "one nation under God with liberty and justice for all," which also included freedom of speech and religion! Because of the commitment the founding fathers of United States made before God to establish this country with Him as their God and Leader, He prospered this country. A Sunday Sermon!


A minister decided that a visual demonstration would add emphasis to his Sunday sermon. Four worms were placed into four separate jars.

ou finished your Business Plan, Congratulations! There are other important steps and procedures involved in getting your business up and running, it may seem like a lot, but well worth the effort in becoming your own boss.

One important procedure is registering your business and business name. Registering a business varies from state to state, so please check online for your state's specific procedures for registering your business. For this article I will be using the state of Pennsylvania. First, you will need to know the filing status of your business: is it a Corporation, Limited Liability Corporation (LLC), Limited Liability Partnership (LLP), Non-Profit, etc. All forms for registering your business are available on the Pennsylvania website: www.dos.pa.gov. Once there, select "Business & Charities" then select, Registration Forms. Descriptions for each filing status for registering is also available online. The forms are very easy to fill out, but if you are uncomfortable with doing so, there are several established businesses that you can reach out to for help. Your business name (fictitious name) and registering your business will be filed simultaneously and will cost approximately \$125.

If you are filing a Corporation, Partnership, or Non-Profit you need to seek the assistance of a Corporate Attorney. Registration for these businesses have additional forms that need processed and may not be available on the website. Plus setting up a Corporation or Non-Profit business, due to tax purposes, may have several choices or options to choose from, so seeking the advice of a lawyer is recommended.


In my opinion, the next important procedure is in the area of money management. Having a good accounting system in place will determine the success of your business. Always keep your personal finances separate from your business finances! Maintain separate checking accounts! I recommend having a budget analysis done to keep you on track and aware of the company's money outflow and inflow. One way of managing company finances is by using financial software. Check with other small business owners about how they are keeping track of their finances (I use Quicken). Also, hiring someone part-time to manage your company's accounting is a very good idea. There are many small businesses that offer bookkeeping and accounting services that you can reach out to for half the price of a well-established accounting firm.

If you have hired staff using a company that specializes in "payroll accounting" is highly recommended. They are qualified in deducting applicable taxes and can submit those taxes to the appropriate Tax Revenue Agencies on your behalf. Plus, you can utilize their service to issue 1099's or W-4's to your employees. Finally, in the area of accounting, make sure you pay yourself a salary, this is where many small business owners make a big mistake. Instead of taking a salary, they pay self as they need money! Wrong! Take a salary even if it is a small one, then increase it as your business grows!


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


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oday we are going to review the life and reign of king Saul. Israel had just gone through approximately 500 years of judges, with the prophet Samuel as the last judge. The children of Israel cried out for a king to rule over them like the other nations because they didn't want God to rule over them, so God gave them what they cried for, a king of their choosing. The Bible tells us they chose a man by the name of Saul, the son of Kish a powerful man. Holy Spirit describes Saul as a "goodlier person" (handsome) and very tall (1 Samuel 9:2). The children of Israel were judging from the outward appearance of man, instead of the "strength" of one's heart. God had the prophet Samuel anoint Saul to be the 1st king in Israel. After Saul was anointed we read, "as Saul walked away, the Spirit of God came upon him and he became another man (1 Samuel 10:6; 9). How long Saul reigned as king is debated by the historians, some believe he reigned 40 years while others believe Saul reigned 22 years before David took the throne. Saul's reign unfortunately was one of disaster because he failed to follow God with his "whole heart." The Lord gave Saul many years and opportunities to surrender his old ways and will for the "will of God." Saul had a difficult time putting off the old man for the new man and he led a life of disregard for God and His word in order to please the people and self.

Old Man vs. New Man: We are told in Ephesians 4:22-24 when we are chosen or called by God, we are to put off the old man and put on the new man. The "old man" is a man of disobedience and unbelief, whereas the "new man" is a man of obedience and belief. We are taught in Psalms 119 that putting off the "old man" is obedience to the Word of God. However, as we continue to read chapter 10 of First Samuel, Saul even though he had the spirit of God on him, struggled putting off the old man and putting on the new man. Saul had many victories as a military warrior but was unsuccessful in his spiritual walk of putting off the "old man" of "people-pleasing and jealous spirit" in exchange for the "new man" offered by God of peace and love. Eventually the true character of his heart was revealed by his lack of commitment to the Lord. Saul's unwillingness to put on the new man of obedience caused him to lose the kingdom, his life and the lives of his son's.

Obedience Is Better Than Sacrifice: In First Samuel 15:7-23 we read, once again, Saul's failure to "put on the new man" demonstrated when he failed to destroy the enemies of God, as instructed by God, and took animals God told him not to take. Samuel meets Saul after the battle and gives him an opportunity to repent, but Saul blames the people for his failure to obey and states that the animals from the enemy's camp would be good as a sacrifice to the Lord. Samuel tells Saul, "obedience is better than sacrifice." When individuals come into the Kingdom of God, Holy Spirit wants to heal them of whatever brokenness found in their lives, but unfortunately many have a difficult time taking off the "old man" and allowing the "new man" to be cleansed by Holy Spirit. This is called the "Saul spirit," which is the spirit of self-sufficiency, the spirit of fear, the spirit of pleasing man, the spirit of envy and jealousy, and the spirit of stubbornness. We need to surrender our old ways and mindsets to God in order to grow in His Kingdom. Because of Saul's failure to surrender these things to God, it cost him his life and, most importantly, it cost him his relationship with Father God. Saul was unable to walk in victory in anything that he did. He was envious of men he thought were better than him or men he thought were trying to take what he had. He failed to learn no man can take from us what Father God has blessed us with. People can only take from us what we give them! Saul never enjoyed a victories walk with God because of his insecurities. When we too have a Saul spirit we can't walk in victory that is already ours, we will lack a sound mind and miss out on the blessings God has planned for our lives. Friends "put off the old man" of flesh and "put on the new man" of Christ so that you can enjoy a victorious life daily.



Book Review


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The Bible is a great book written about a King and His Kingdom. It reveals why the most important King, ever, left His Heavenly throne to redeem lost man.

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
Acknowledge God In all your ways and

He will direct your path. Prov. 3:5-6 s we are going through our lives daily, it is so easy to forget what our priority should be or where we came from in reference to God. We become so preoccupied with life that our mind becomes clouded because of the busyness that distracts us from what's important. But, we must take the time to make an adjustment in order to return to our first landmark of knowing it was God's mercy that brought us to where we are, and He is still the same yesterday, today and forever. (Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever. Hebrews 13:8).

The Lord has given to us many examples in the scriptures for us to follow as our guide for living, and that He means what he says and says what he means. One such example is from the life of king Uzziah, found in 2 Chronicles 26:1-5 and 2 Chronicles 26:15-21. This is known as the "before and after" because king Uzziah allowed his position to blind him to the fact of God's holiness and God's order of things. If you will notice 2 Chronicles 26:1-5 says king Uzziah was crowned king at the young age of sixteen. During this time, in his first few years, he was humble and he allowed God to use him to do great things as long as he sought him.

Sadly though, king Uzziah didn't stay humble as he was from the beginning of his reign, instead he allowed his pride to rule his life (2 Kings 26:15-21). His pride blinded him of the fact that, regardless of our position in leadership, we must follow God's orders or we will cause serious consequences in our lives.

When king Uzziah got out of line with God's order, the Lord had to remind him through a serious judgment that He (God) is still the highest authority and we must submit to his will. This principle still holds true for us today, God loves us enough to try to prevent us from trouble through warning, but if we won't listen to his warning, this same love has to become judgment on our part.



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Pray: Believe and Forgive

hen we pray we must always have faith that God hears us, or why else do we pray? Some times we pray and we are already defeated in our mind because deep down inside there's doubt. Other times our prayers are more of a formality and ritual because our motive has become a duty rather than that of simple faith. Our Heavenly Father will hear and answer us according to His will, purpose, and time.

Another hindrance to our prayer life is "unforgiveness." Most of us don't want to deal with this because it makes us uncomfortable, so we simply suppress it and move on. Jesus gives us the right prescription to solve these problems on our journey with Him—if we use the principles found in the Gospel of Mark 11:24-26—there we will find our answer to changes in our prayers and in our lives. Changes for our good! "Therefore, I say unto you, what things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them. And when ye stand praying, forgive, if ye have ought against any: that your Father also which is in Heaven may forgive you your trespasses. But if ye do not forgive, neither will your Father which is in Heaven forgive your trespasses."

Jesus left us an example to follow when we pray, we should not take this lightly because God's Word is absolute truth, not just to read, not just to quote and memorize, but to obey and put into action daily. Be inspired by the Words of Jesus in Mark 11, they will transform your life, because they are life!



After these things Paul departed from Athens, and came to Corinth; And found a certain Jew named Aquila, born in Pontus, lately come from Italy, with his wife Priscilla; (because that Claudius had commanded all Jews to depart from Rome:) and came unto them. Acts 18:1-2 KJV

uke the author of the Book of Acts introduces readers to married couple, Aquila and Priscilla, who had just arrived in Corinth. It's around the year AD 30, not a good time for Christians and Jews. Many Jews and Gentiles were being persecuted for converting to Christianity, and Claudius commanded all Jews to depart from Rome (Acts 18:2). Luke doesn't record Priscilla's ethnicity or religious background, but he does let us know that her husband Aquila is of Jewish background born in Pontus and he was a tentmaker by trade. So with this decree from Claudius, the couple had to leave their home and business and ventured to Corinth. What we will learn of this couple is that they had a oneness in spirit; when Luke mentions Priscilla, Aquila's name always follows, they were inseparable. They two worked together, worshiped together, served for the Lord together, and both loved the Lord with all their heart.

Priscilla and her husband met Apostle Paul while living in Corinth and they became good friends and big supporters of Paul. Priscilla and Aquila were not only known to be big supporters of Paul, but also well known missionaries. They lived, worked, and traveled with Paul, who described them as his "fellow workers in Christ Jesus." This is recorded in Acts that after many months of ministering in Corinth, Paul traveled to Ephesus to establish a Church there and took Priscilla and Aquila with him (Acts 18:19; 24-28; 1 Cor. 16:19). Paul however, didn't stay in Ephesus, he left the couple there stating he needed to attend the feast in Jerusalem.

Having a missionary's heart Priscilla and Aquila established a church in Ephesus that met in their home. This enabled them the opportunity to show hospitality to both sinners and saints. Priscilla and Aquila were a godly couple who were not afraid to preach the gospel of good news in spite of pending persecution. Paul tells the Church in Rome that the couple risked their lives for him for the furtherance of the gospel.

Historians also record Priscilla and Aquila as a good "example of a preacher/teacher" in the early first century Church. This had to be a very trying and difficult time serving as a missionary, but they didn't let the threat of persecution stop them from preaching and teaching to all the good news of the Gospel. For example, after hearing the preacher, Apollos, preaching in the synagogue the way of the Lord by the baptism of John only, they took him aside and explained to him "the way of God more perfectly," which is Jesus and Him crucified (Acts 18:26

This spirit-filled couple, working together in both ministry and with their tentmaking business, always put God first in all that they did, and this is demonstrated by how they opened their home up to the local church and offered hospitality to traveling preachers. They put their lives on the line for Paul's sake and moved from their native home for the Gospel's sake. This couple worked together with a oneness of intimacy for the Gospel and the Lord protected them and took care of them by making sure all their needs were met (Matt. 6:33). The life of Priscilla and Aquila should encourage all spirit-filled couples to follow this godly example. They didn't allow persecution and the dictates of the world to be their focus, instead they placed their heart and mind on the one who could give them life everlasting - Jesus Christ.



The Bible patriarchs Enoch (Genesis 5:24, Hebrews 11:5) and Elijah (2 Kings 2:11) didn't experience death, but most of us live in a

My son gave me a "Smart Light Bulb" and we have Google Home Mini. As I sit here drinking from my smart cup, I am reminded of a cartoon I enjoyed watching as a teenager "The Jetsons." This cartoon, which aired in the early 60's, was a futuristic cartoon with characters living in a fast paced lifestyle.

The mode of transportation were vehicles that looked like spaceships. Homes were what we today call "smart homes." Robots were the family's maid. Communications was a smart TV with visual display. I can remember watching this cartoon show thinking life will never be like that. Wrong, we have embraced the futuristic lifestyle of the Jetsons. All new homes, if you can afford them, are smart homes. The newest apartment buildings are now called "smart complex" living; vehicles are now self driven! You know who is walking on your property without opening your door; you can talk to your stove, talk to your refrigerator, talk to your water facet; command your cell phone to make calls, I am just skimming the surface, because I haven't even listed advancements from the medical field, but I am quite sure you readers get the idea. The futuristic technology that concerns me the most is the technology of getting a micro-chip implant because it makes it "faster" to get through checkout lines or to clock into work!

My biggest complaint about all this futuristic technology is that man has forgotten who has given them the ability to create and develop this smart technology. Plus, everyone is in a big hurry to out do each other. When reading articles or listening to news updates about this "smart technology" it is quite obvious man is trying to make themselves independent from their Creator. This is when individuals need to read the Bible and pay close attention to what's really happening in this world. In the Book of Revelation we are given a warning about this: "And he causeth all, both small and great, rich and poor, free and bond, to receive a mark in their right hand, or in their foreheads: And that no man might buy or sell, save he that had the mark, or the name of the beast, or the number of his name. Here is wisdom. Let him that hath understanding count the number of the beast: for it is the number of a man; and his number is six hundred threescore and six" (Revelation 13:16-18 KJV). Several articles have been written about employees having this micro-chip implant in their hands, along with news updates on national TV on how easy it is to have micro-chip implants. Individuals need to wake up and learn what God has to say about this subject instead of being closed minded about this topic. Many think there is nothing wrong with the implant. Unfortunately, they don't realize this is just dress rehearsal before the "real mark" will be mandatory. They will be so desensitized in their minds that they will be fooled into taking the "real mark" from the beast, who is satan.
